Option A: Message in a Bottle Imagine Santiago could write a message describing his adventures at sea to Manolin. Write this message to Manolin as if you were Santiago. What events would be the most important to share? What symbols should be included in these events? With Manolin as an audience, imitate how you think Santiago would write. Must be one typed page using standard typing format for this class.

Option B: Dear Diary Santiago begins to keep a diary of his adventures at sea while catching the marlin. Write 2-3 diary entries the display the most important events that happen to Santiago so far. What events would be most important for Santiago to reflect on? What symbols should be included in these events? With Santiago himself as the audience, imitate how you think Santiago would write. Must be one typed page using standard typing format for this class

Option C: Art Gallery Upon returning to land, Santiago wants an artist to properly depict his great adventure at sea. Create 1-2 drawing/ paintings/ pieces of art that display the most important events that happen to Santiago so far. (Must be neat, relevant to story and clear) What events would be most important to share visually? What symbols should be included in these events? With viewers of the art as the audience, write Santiago's description of the art in first person point of view about what is depicted. Must be ¾ typed page using standard typing format for this class.
